

HEAR ALL ABOUT IT: UTAH'S NATIONALLY ACCLAIMED BALLET COMPANY



Why would **Michael Scolamiero** choose to leave the Miami City Ballet to come to Salt Lake City? Join us at our **April 9 luncheon** and discover what attracted him to Utah's Ballet West.

Mr. Scolamiero's appointment as Executive director of Ballet West came after an international search led by Michael Kaiser, President Emeritus of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. Mr. Scolamiero served for 17 years as Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Ballet Company, the longest tenure at any major ballet company. He came here from the Miami City Ballet where he led the organization to financial stability and new artistic

distinction.

Ballet West's humble beginnings originated in old WWII barracks on the University of Utah campus. It grew from a small civic ballet company to becoming the first ballet company in the country associated with a degree-granting institution. Today, Ballet West enjoys national and international recognition.

Mr. Scolamiero is looking forward to getting to know our community. He also expects to make a major contribution to the newly completed strategic plan for the growth and expansion of Ballet West as an essential element of Salt Lake's artistic community. We're eager to hear his vision for the next phase of Ballet West's remarkable 56-year history.

EMERITI CLUB GETAWAY: Yellowstone in Winter



What could be more beautiful than Yellowstone National Park in wintertime? If you agree you will want to start planning now for a 2-night Serenity Winter getaway next February 26-27, 2020. These tours sell out fast, which is why we are making arrangements so many months in advance. Space can only be held to the end of this month!

This excursion includes: two nights' lodging, one day snowcoach tour to either Old Faithful or the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, two hot breakfasts, one prime rib dinner, and IMAX theatre tickets.

Drive your own car to/from West Yellowstone (Lodge address: 217 Yellowstone Ave.). We could perhaps do some carpooling if people are interested.

The <u>price for the full package</u> described above is based on your choice of accommodation: You may choose to stay at either the Three Bear Lodge (package price \$318.90 per person double occupancy, tax included), or the Three Bear Motel (\$281.50). The handsome Lodge is known for its oversized rooms and its unique furniture handcrafted from reclaimed wood. The comfortable Motel is recently refurbished; guests have full use of the Lodge common areas and amenities. The package prices above do not include the National Park entrance fee (*do you have your Senior Pass?*), incidentals, or gratuities (15%).

How to Sign Up: Those who wish to be part of this exciting excursion should <u>contact See Yellowstone</u> <u>directly</u> to book with a \$50 deposit. Tell Terrie (or whomever you speak with) that you are part of the "University of Utah Emeritus Professors Group," so that we can be together on the same snowcoach. Terms & Conditions: A \$50 per person deposit is required upon booking with final payment due 45 days prior to arrival. If you must cancel after the Deposit has been received, you will lose \$25. The cancellation penalty after Final Payment is 50%, with no refunds 15 days prior to arrival.
